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### ESSAY QUESTION

In the spring of 1650, the Diggers suffered a blow which finally forced them out of their settlement. Gerrard Winstanley wrote about it in the pamphlet *An Humble Request to the Ministers of both Universities*:

'(...) Thereupon at the Command of this Parson Plat, they set fire to six houses, and burned them down, and burned likewise some of their housholdstufte, and wearing Clothes, throwing their beds, atooles, and housholdstufte, up and down the Common, not pittying the cries of many little Children, and their frighted Mothers, which are Parishioners borne in the Parish (...)'
