Audio Transcription

Helen: Wimbledon High School, yes, well I was there until I took my Matric [Matriculation], and I was in the Sixth Form – Lower Sixth. But that was in 1942, and the war was not going too well at that time, and I was a member of the Junior Air Corps. And we used to have meetings, we had uniform. Bridget and I both went there – I mean, went to weekly meetings, on bicycles. And we did, you know, Morse Code and stuff like that. And we did marching. And when I joined up, I already knew how to march, which is quite satisfying actually. We met in a school in Walton – just beyond the station in Walton. Why, I don't know! I think it was something that probably, you know, maybe Lucy, Bridget – I've no idea, but anyway we did, we cycled there. But we didn't, you know, we weren't – we were learning things about aircraft recognition, we did some Morse Code, we marched, we did some drills.

Interviewer: Would you say you had a generally happy time there?

Helen: Yes.

Interviewer: Was that – was it like an after-school thing or on weekends?

Helen: Oh yes, it was, I think it was probably – really, I can't remember the day, probably Friday evening. Yes, it wasn't, it was after school obviously, yes, not weekends.
